Waste Management Trailer {ATM 1999kg}

Our reason for designing, manufacturing and promoting our Waste Management Trailer.

- Remote communities require very SAFE, robust and simple to operate support equipment to sustain the required service.
- A) Robust to handle the not so perfect road conditions in most remote communities. We build in a minimum 25% extra design tolerance.

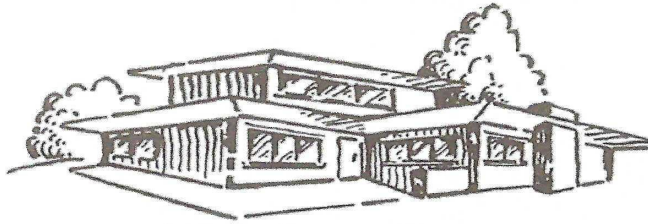

Aims of the Elders Visiting Program


