SUMMARY:

At the Tennant Creek Local Authority Meeting on 5th June 2018, members passed a motion to recommend that Council spend \$64,000 on a shade structures for the Tennant Creek Show Grounds.

The Local Authority papers are attached for Council information.

CEO has advised that the proposal may not fall within the scope that LA funds can be spent on.

To clarify what is deemed appropriate expenditure for Local Authorities, clarification was sought from the Department of Housing and Community Development. The below advice was received from the Senior Director Sustainability and Compliance Local Government and Community Development Division.

Advice reads:

In relation to LA funding, this is funding provided to the council to assist with delivering projects recommended by their respective Local Authorities. It is ultimately up to the council to decide to approve (or not) the recommendations submitted for its consideration. Under the Act, it is the council (ie elected members collectively) responsible for making decisions – including the decision on what projects will / will not be progressed through LA fund. Councillors must not feel pressured to approve LA project recommendations.

The current local authority project funding guidelines are very broad and do not specifically allow or prohibit the type of projects recommended by the Tennant Creek local authority. However, caution needs to be taken on investing funds in projects that are not in the council's control.

Please let me know if you require any further information.

Risks

As per the advice above, Council is urged to be cautious when considering approving funding for projects that are not under Councils control. Information that Council should consider is:

- If a person is injured by the structure council may be liable.
- This infrastructure would not be under council control
- Council could be required to maintain the equipment and pay for future costs to ensure the structures are safe
- The proposal is not assessed as being part of Council's core business.
- The Minister could interpret this project as being contrary to the guidelines.
- Council has numerous facilities and projects that require funding for improvement including ANZAC Hill, Staunton Street Oval, Eldorado Park and projects identified by the Local Authority for inclusion in the five year infrastructure plan.

Recommendation

After careful consideration the recommendation is not to approve the funding as requested due to the risks above.

Below we have included information on the functions of the Local Authorities and the guidelines on Local Authority funding.

BACKGROUND

53D Functions of local authority

The functions of a local authority are:

- (a) to involve local communities more closely in issues related to local government; and
- (b) to ensure that local communities are given an opportunity to express their opinions on questions affecting local government; and
- (c) to allow local communities a voice in the formulation of policies for the locality as well as policies for the area and the region; and
- (d) to take the views of local communities back to the regional council and act as advocates on their behalf; and
- (e) to contribute to the development of the relevant regional plan; and
- (f) to make recommendations to the council in relation to the council's budget, and to review expenditures by the council, in relation to the part of the council's area within which the local authority performs its functions; and
- (g) to perform other functions assigned to the local authority by the Minister, in accordance with any guidelines that the Minister may make.

53E Limits on functions of local authority

- a) A local authority must comply with any guidelines that the Minister may make.
- b) A local authority is subject to control and direction by the council, subject to any guidelines that the Minister may make.

Local Authority Funding

The local authority project funding pool supports priority community projects that encourage the continued development of local authorities and their respective communities.

The addition of any new local authorities is not automatic and requires consultation on a case by case basis. All new local authorities require ministerial approval.

The funding aims to:

- build stronger communities
- assist community projects as recommended by local authorities
- help local governing bodies and their communities they present to become stronger and self-sustaining
- provide quality community infrastructure that facilitates community activity and integration
- develop local government capacity to provide legitimate representation, effective governance improved service delivery and sustainable development.

The funding commenced in 2014-15 and is re-current. The funding is non-application based and is distributed through a methodology developed by the Northern Territory Grants Commission.

What you can use the funding for

The following are examples of how you can use the funding:

- repairs and maintenance of community assets controlled or owned by the council
- acquiring plant and equipment directly related to local government service delivery
- upgrading or enhancing community sporting facilities.

If the proposed project relies on pre-conditions (such as the acquisition of a section 19 lease under the *Aboriginal Land Rights (Northern Territory) Act*), then the project should not be undertaken until there is conclusive evidence that the condition will not hinder the progress of the project for which funds have been allocated.

What you can't spend funding on

You can't use funding for any of the following:

- buying vehicles or paying fuel expenses
- paying salaries or cash prizes
- purposes that are not of a local government nature that are relevant to another NT Government department.

Administration and/or project management fees are not to be levied on this grant funding

COMMUNITY EVENTS HUB

This multi – year project initiated by Barkly Regional Arts is a joint project with the Tennant Creek District Show Society to invest in a community space for the development of a 'Community Events Hub'; a multipurpose site for community events and activities.

This project initiative was developed out of Barkly Regional Arts' need to create a permanent site for its communities annual Desert Harmony Festival, as the cost to continue making multiple sites around the town functional and safe for events, is becoming increasingly expensive.

The following facilities will be developed over a two-year period 2018 - 2019.

This project is co-funded by:

Barkly Regional Arts (\$26,250.00) (2018)

Tennant Creek Show Committee (Jubilee Trust) (\$50,000.00) (2018)

Building Better Regions Fund –Community Investment stream (\$14,750.00) (2018)

Festivals NT (\$11,000.00) (2018 + 2019)

PROJECT PROPOSAL**Shading**

Four (4) large shade sails are being created and erected at the Tennant Creek Show Grounds. These are permanent shade sails with the sails being able to be taken down and up for each event/activity, but the hardware would be permanently in the ground.

These large shade sails provide extensive cover for audiences at events at the Show Grounds.

The shade sails are being erected in the following places at the TC Show Grounds:

- Nancy Ford Main Arena (next to carnival site)
- Community eating area (centre of site)
- The newly built outdoor 'The Kitchen' space (next to members pavilion)
- Kids Club space (next to the public bathrooms)

The shade sails are different in size with the largest being at the Nancy Ford Main arena: 10m x 20 m with 6m extension for stage.

All shade sails come with engineering approval.

The project is also a training project with the lead project installation artist training members of the community in how to install shade sails as well as a youth outcome of design and painting shade sails in the July school holidays.

OTHER FACILITIES (not as part of this funding)

Box Office

Total budget required \$31k

Funding committed \$11k

We are building a mobile box office to capture audiences in the town camps and sell tickets in the community for a month prior to the festival. To create a mini event around ticket sales and festival information. This mobile box office then relocates to the Community Events Hub as a permanent box office.

The next stages of the Box Office will be to add:

- Office equipment, such as computers and printers for tickets and Festival information
- Connecting phone/internet lines.
- Power, lighting and air.
- Signage
- Shade for ticket line
- Disability ramp

Indoor/Outdoor Kitchen

Total budget required \$150k

Funding committed \$61k

'Dinner Under the Stars' is an evening event produced in collaboration between Barkly Regional Arts and Karen's Kitchen Indigenous Hospitality Company and has been the most popular event in the Desert Harmony Festival, having sold out each year since 2012. The event consists of a fine dining experience, entertainment, matched wine and an MC that highlights information about the ingredients, meal and wine all whilst enjoying our beautiful outdoors. Due to venue constraints, this has historically been a once off event at the Festival. Though as part of our innovative move for the Desert Harmony Festival to have a permanent Festival site, Barkly Regional Arts and the Tennant Creek Show Society are partnering to construct a permanent outdoor venue space for this event at the Desert Harmony Festival, to enable programming of 'Dinner under the Stars' to occur each day of the festival. This opens up to events/activities such as the Barkly Beef Dinner, Territory Day, Show Day, Campdraft, Rodeo's, NAIDOC, cooking classes with youth groups (Girl Guides), corporate events and fundraising days.

Event comfort

Total budget required \$70k

Funding committed \$30k

Providing comfortable and accessible venues for audiences in our remote environment and incoming visitor experiences.

Adding on to an existing large shed, funds will be used to turn this space into a multi-purpose indoor venue.

Solar lights \$9k

To increase venue safety lighting to light up parking lots and dark areas, we will purchase a few solar lights. These need to be of a tall height to decrease vandalism. It is our mission to create the Community Events Hub as an ecologically friendly venue and take advantage of our desert weather.

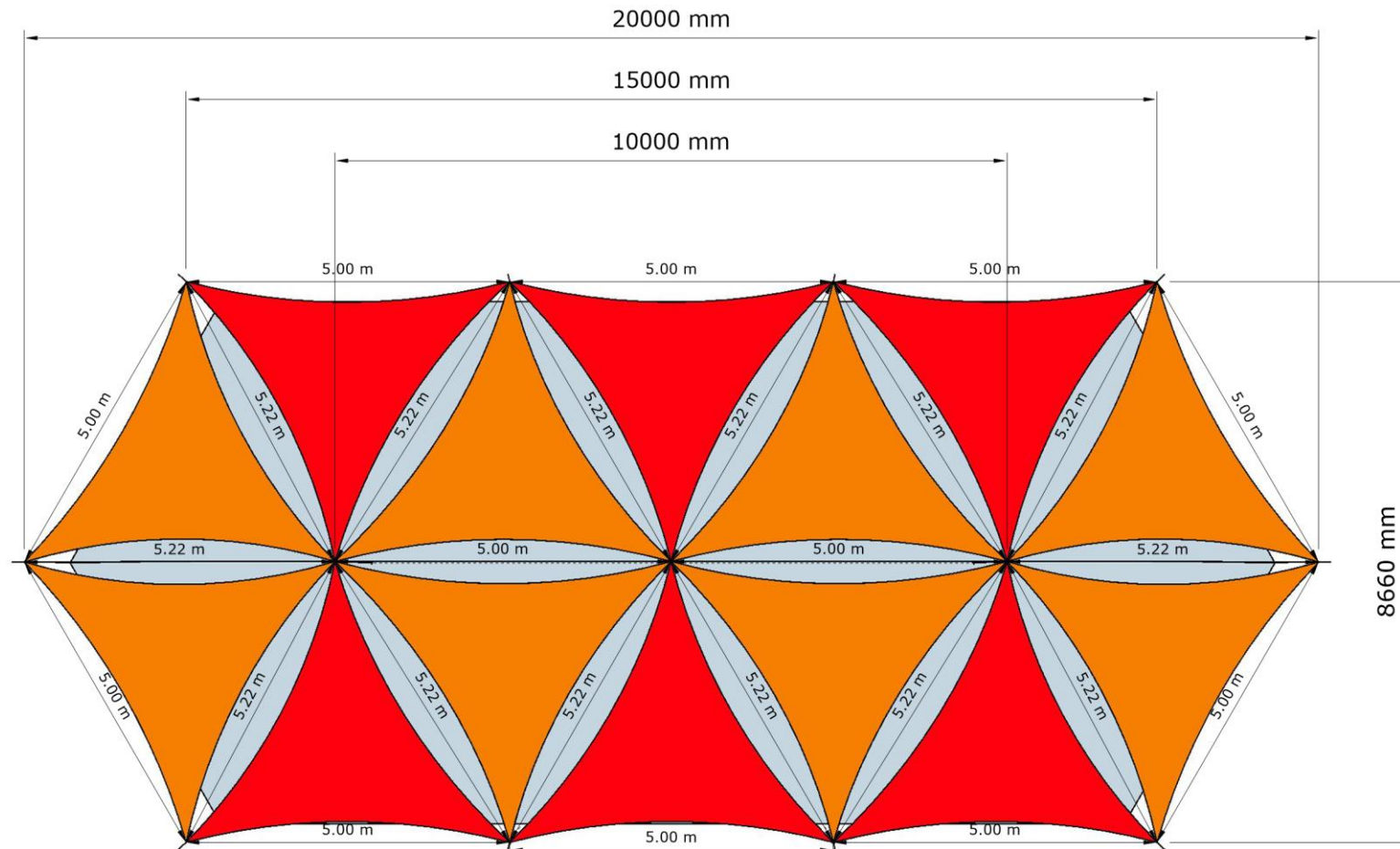

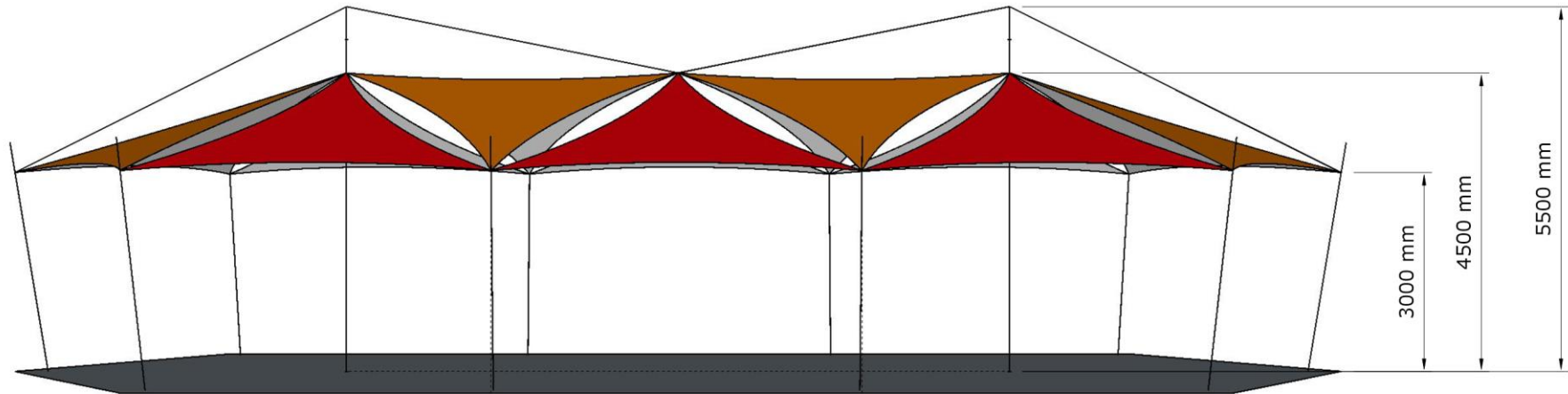

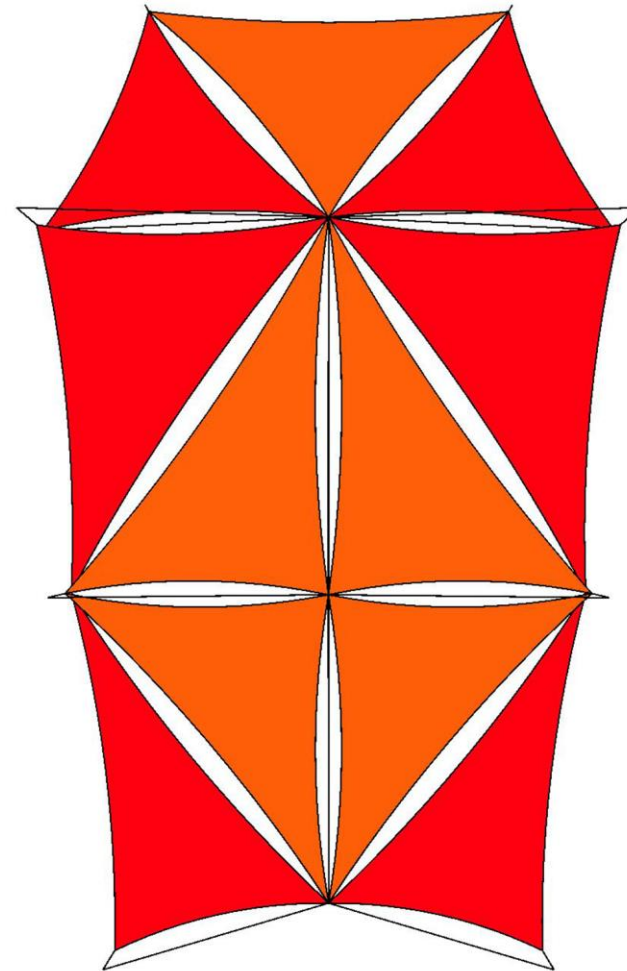

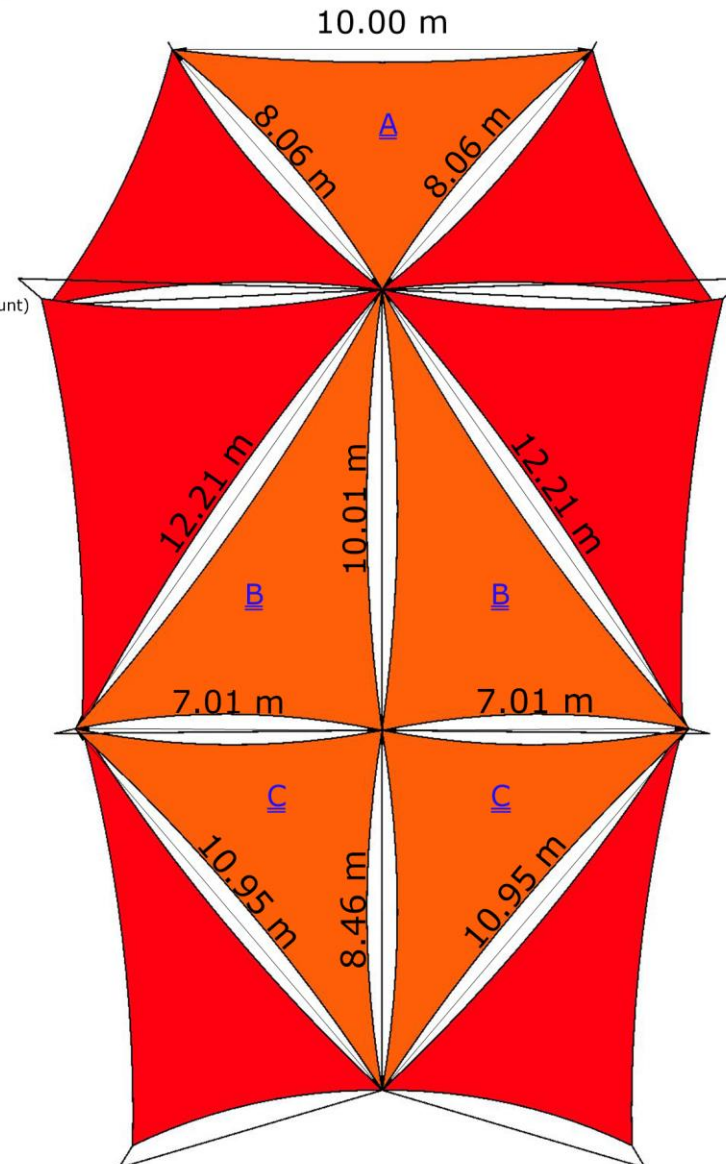

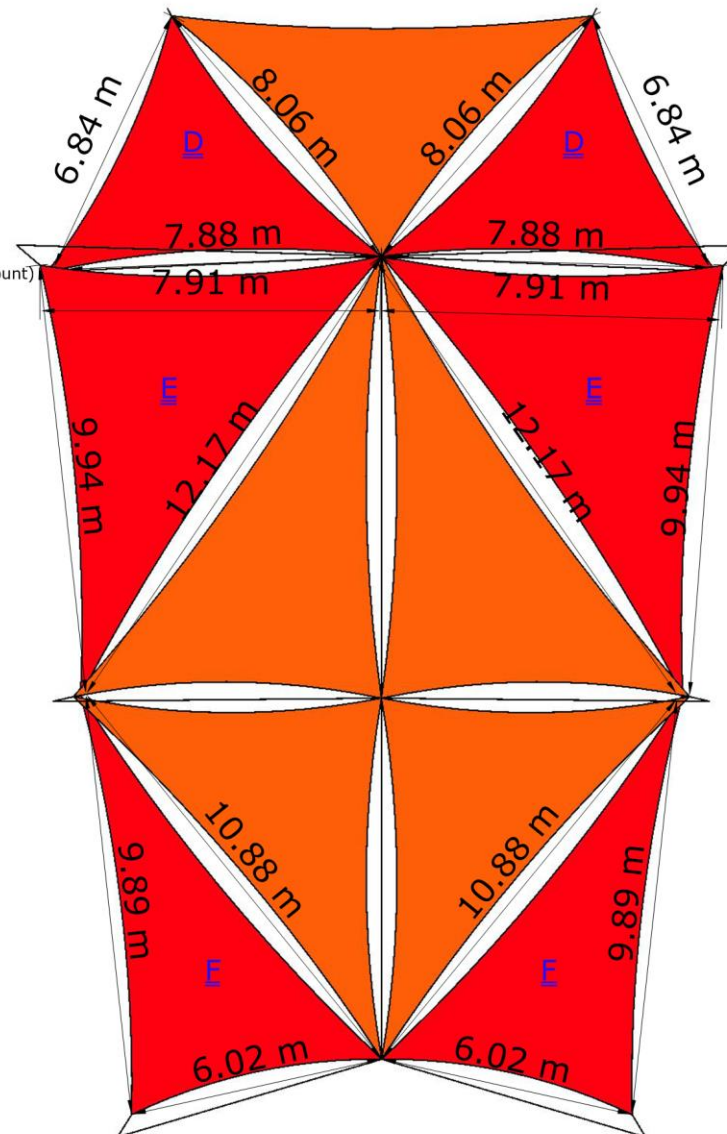

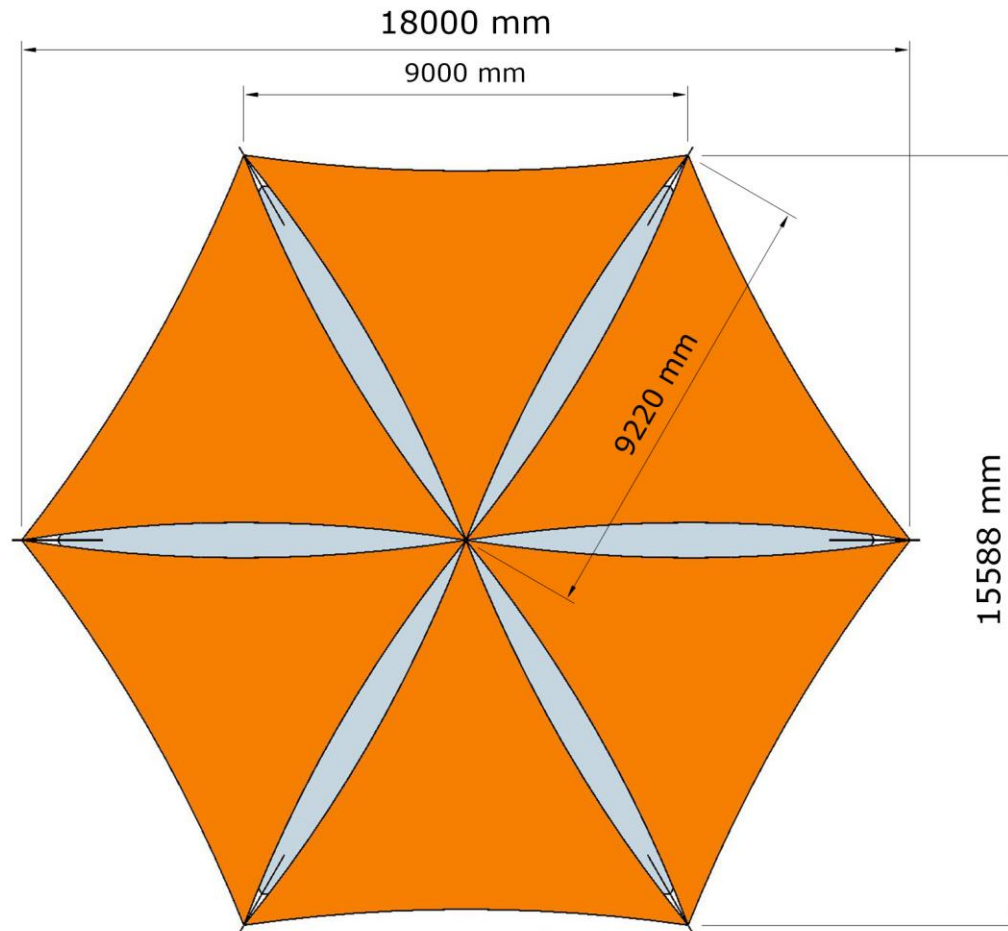


TOP VIEW

18MT HEX STRUCTURE OF 6X (9000mm X 9220mm X 9220mm) SHADE TRIANGLES

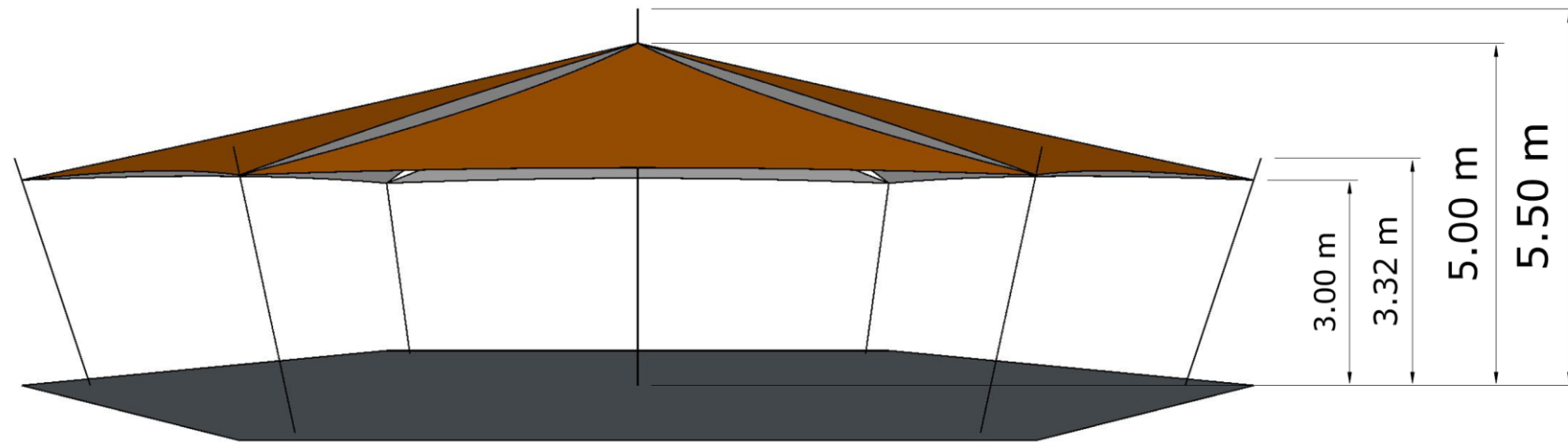


FRONT VIEW

18MT HEX STRUCTURE OF 6X (9000mm X 9220mm X 9220mm) SHADE TRIANGLES

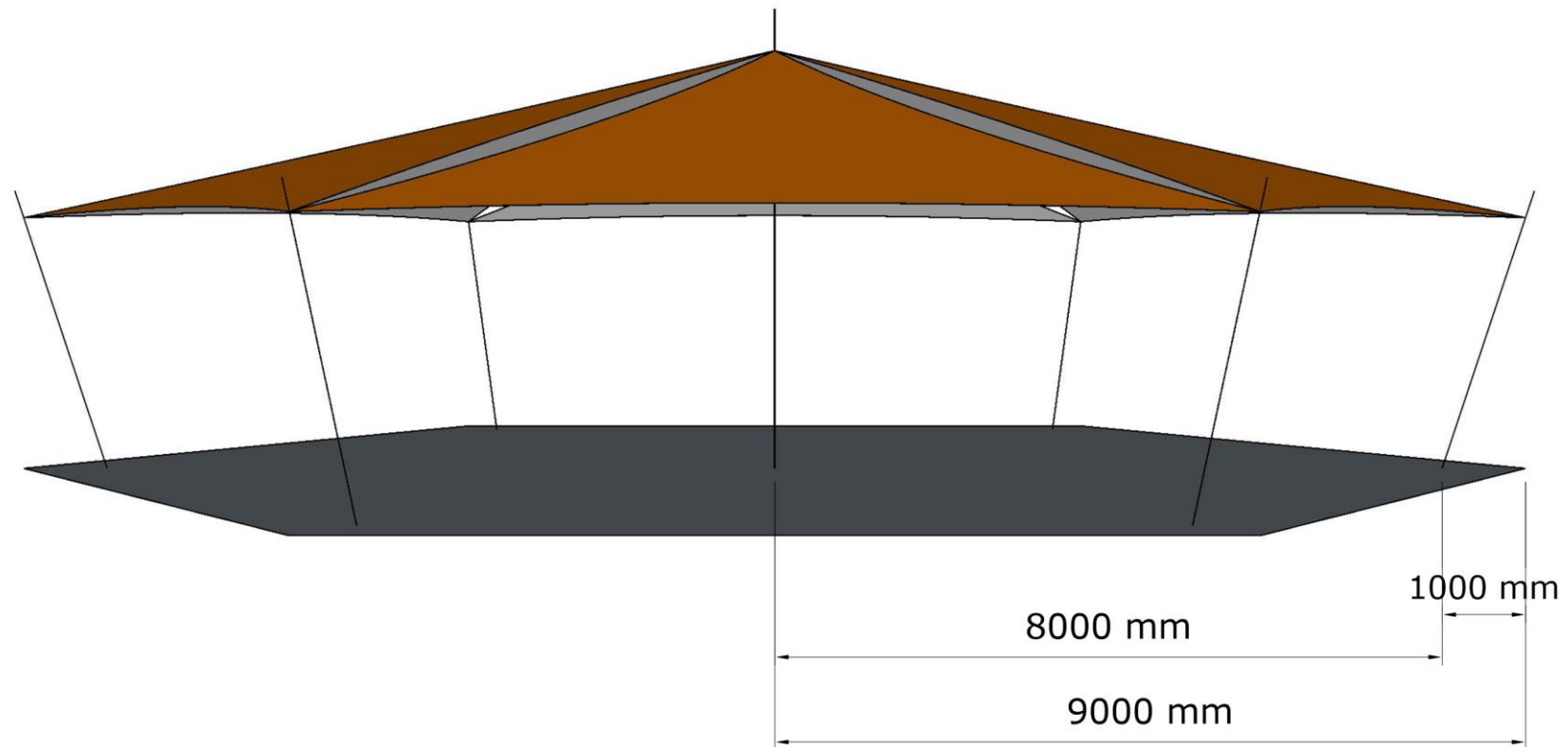


EXTERNAL POLE OFFSET DIMENTIONS
