The Way We Will Work

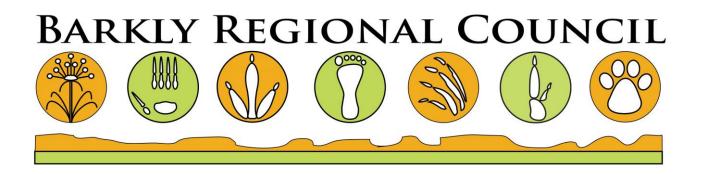



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Outlined below are the current youth projects being delivered by Barkly Regional Council to the Region.

- \$9m Purkiss reserve upgrade including multipurpose field, refurbished tennis courts, parkland play equipment and improvements to the ALF field
- New roof over Epenarra and Ali Curung basketball courts
- The Tennant Creek Local Authority is looking to provide shade over play equipment at Mary Ann Dam
- New Hilda Street park
- Funding for new youth centre's in Tennant Creek and Ali Curing
- Funding for new bike path along the main drain
- Additional street lighting around Peko Park, Ambrose Street and Staunton Street oval
- Complete Staunton Street oval upgrade

Council has a variety of responsibilities we look after:

- Public parks and gardens Purkiss Reserve Lake Mary Ann Eldorado Park ANZAC Hill Hilda Street Park (yet to be handed over) Kathleen Park Pilgrim Park Other vacant Council land Parks in Communities
- Roads in town
- The swimming pool
- Collect rubbish and look after the tip
- Cut grass in public areas
- Sweep the streets
- Run the dog pound
- Enforce by-laws
- Collect Rates
- Run programs we are paid to run including: Sports & Rec – not in TC Aged care – not in TC

After School care – not in TC Youthlinks Night patrol – not in TC Safe houses – not in TC Libraries

Council would be eager to hear what you think of our current facilities and what could be done to improve them. We know we have an issue with a number of parks in town, vandalism and cost of maintenance restricts what we may be able to do.
