The School made some big achievements in 2016, with regularly attending students making bigger achievements than we have previously seen with students in transition and year one already reading. The school has also introduced Pre Vet hospitality for the older students, giving them skills which they can use in the workplace when they leave school.

The school has received a lot of support from local services.

Homemakers is providing breakfast everyday to all students who arrive on time. This has been a huge success with students beginning to arrive to school earlier. The school is working on getting Centrelink payments forms done by families so that homemakers have enough money to provide hot breakfasts every now and then.

The shop has begun to enforce the 'no school no service" policy, supporting the community message that school is important. Some families continue to put pressure on the store managers by taking their children there during school time. Any support with this would be appreciated

CDP have been working closely with the school to maintain the grounds. Raven and his team have been extremely helpful with mowing lawns and getting the garden **prepared**.

Sport and Rec have also linked in with the school and we are working together to provide programs to encourage participation and school attendance.

Unfortunately attendance continues to decline. Due to the low attendance the school has lost a lot of money. We have had to lose a teacher as well as funding for excursions, uniforms, play equipment, computers, etc... if this continues the school will continue to lose staff and Alekarenge School will not be able to properly educate Ali Curung children. It has been identified that drinking, gambling, family fighting and parents sleeping in are major factors in stopping children coming to school. Any assistance in helping families get their children to school would be appreciated.
