### John James Barker obituary 1947

**Mr. J. J. Barker**, who died at Tennant Creek Hospital recently at the age of 50, was well known in the city and Central Australia. On his return from World War I, he was employed by the PMG department for 18 years, but resigned to take over the management of the Goldfields Hotel at Tennant Creek. At the time of his death he was manager of Singleton Station, near Wycliffe Well. **Mr. Barker** at one time was well known as an amateur rider at Royal Shows, and rode in several Hunt Club Cups at Morphettville. He was the second son of the late **Felix and Mary Barker**, of Canowie Belt, and leaves a widow, formerly Miss **Kitty Fox**, of Belalie North, one son and one daughter.
